- > As per your guidance we have implemented sound inventory practice more impactful, earlier we were maintaining Emergency Medicine, LASA, FIFO only. Now we are maintaining LIFO, VED (Important, Necessary and Desirable). It helps us to manage the pharmacy better.
- First In, First Out (FIFO) This method assumes that the first products you acquired will be the first that are sold.
- Last-In, First-Out (LIFO)

The LIFO method assumes that the most recent products added to a company's inventory have been sold first

## VED

"V" items are vital drugs, without alternatives, forming about 10% of the total drugs whose absence cannot be tolerated

"E" Items are the Essential items that constitute 40% of the items and their absence can be tolerated for the short stretch of time

"D" items are the desirable items which are the remaining 50% of the drugs and their non-availability can be tolerated for longer period.
